Dear Secretary Perdue,

Yesterday at an event during which he announced aid for American farmers, President Trump suggested terminating the importation of beef cattle from foreign countries.

While OCM agrees with that strategy, we feel it does not go far enough. The U.S. must also ban beef imports, especially beef imported from Brazil. The February 2020 lift of the ban on Brazilian beef imports, which we opposed, was a mistake, and it needs to be reversed.

OCM recently called for a breakup of the Big Four meatpacking companies. The current levels of consolidation in agriculture are unsustainable, and our food system must be restructured. This restructuring must occur not only from the top down, but also from the ground up. That is why we are currently working proactively with our members and stakeholders to develop policy recommendations for a transition to a more decentralized food system.

The market disruption caused by Covid-19 has left cattle producers hurting across the country. Low prices, processing bottlenecks and drought have put unprecedented pressure on American farmers and ranchers. In the absence of Country of Origin Labeling, to continue to allow imported cattle and foreign beef to unfairly compete with domestic producers and products is the equivalent of kicking American ranchers while they are down.

By implementing a ban on imported cattle and beef, and by allowing American farmers and ranchers to feed America, we can hopefully weather this trying time in our nation's history and together rebuild an agriculture and food economy that will enrich our rural and urban communities and nourish our nation's people.
